



I hope you did well in our game, but more importantly, I hope you had a little fun! The topic of nicknames came to mind recently as I reflected on an article I read a few years ago which focused on a geographic area referred to as...The Graveyard of the Atlantic, our last nickname above. Sure sounds ominous, doesn't it? The nickname, as some of you may already know, describes the infamous coastline of North Carolina. With its barrier islands, hard to see shoals, and tricky multi-directional winds, the North Carolina coast is a complicated nautical terrain in the best of times and with up-to-date instrumentation, but was an absolute life and death gamble in centuries past. And this particular article described a 17th century British vessel that was lost from historical record when attempting a Carolina landing, only to be rediscovered roughly 20 years ago, one of many buried crafts in the aforementioned "graveyard".

For some reason, the thought of a sunken ship and the myriad possibilities of what may be buried on board such a vessel stirs the imagination for many of us. Maybe we've read one too many adventure story over the years, but the thought of long-forgotten treasure is hard to put out of one's mind. And in this particular submerged ship, treasure was indeed found, but not in the form of jewelry or coins which we would so readily expect. Instead of glittering gold or sparkling gems, the prized discovery, interestingly, were carefully wrapped small packets found safe and remarkably dry within a large, sealed chest. For 300+ years, this chest merely sat motionless underwater, yet when finally opened and the packets unsealed, revealed a variety of well-preserved seeds. It quickly became obvious that among this ship's cargo were these small, delicate European seeds meant for planting in the New World. And while this was certainly an exciting find, the truly amazing part of the story was still to come. Instead of placing the seeds under glass in a museum, along with the other antique plunder, the decision was made that the seeds should actually be planted. Yes, after all that time, the seeds were finally to be placed in the North American soil. And the result? Not all, but many of the seeds took to the soil, developed roots, and began to grow! Literally centuries had passed by, but the seeds, when finally able to connect with the soil, took root. The seeds were ultimately able to do what they were created to do...to grow.

This archaeological story can hopefully serve as a reminder for us of an easily overlooked fact, which is that God has created all things to grow....those forgotten seeds, the grass on the ground, your pet puppy, but most importantly, you and me. You see, God is life itself. God is the beginning and the end and all points in between. And as God's children, we've not only been given life, we have the ability designed within us, from our creator, to grow. The growth I am alluding to is our inner growth, our spiritual growth; our becoming more and more like Christ, who came not only to save us from this fallen world, but to transform our lives while making our way through the journey.

This may sound odd, but to wake up each day and have breath in our lungs doesn't truly mean we are alive....in the spiritual sense. In fact, there are many who are "alive" in this life, but exist more like the buried seeds in that sunken ship. Case in point. Years ago, while conducting a pre-marriage group, a young groom to be, after describing some of his more unpleasant characteristics, much to the dismay of his future wife, concluded his statements by saying, "This is who I am, and this is who I'll be. I don't have any intention of changing." The young man got a few chuckles from a couple of the other grooms in the group, which was likely his goal, but his comments brought to light a truth in our humanness. To grow, to become more like Christ as we make this life journey, is actually a choice. It always has been and always will be.

Even in the Old Testament, after the Israelites personally experienced the astounding presence of God on their behalf, they still needed to be challenged by Moses, in the book of Deuteronomy, when he chided, "This day I call the heavens and the earth as witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live and that you may love the LORD your God, listen to his voice, and hold fast to him. If folks who saw mighty waters pushed back like a curtain and manna

pouring down from the heavens needed a firm reminder of their responsibility to choose life, then we all need the same. We are meant to be alive, alert, and growing. And even if one of us has been a slumbering seed, so to speak, we are never too far gone to wake up and begin to grow, because that is God's design.

Those forgotten seeds began to grow, finally, because they were settled into the necessary setting of the soil, receiving the required feeding from the rain, and the all-important light of the warm sun. The seeds were unlocked from their shells, allowing them to become what they were always intended to be. You and I are no different. But when it comes to the environments we choose to live in (the soil), or what we choose to put in our bodies through our eyes, ears, or mouth (the rain), or whether we walk in the companionship of the light of God (the sun), all are choices we must make for ourselves. We must always remember that God loves us completely and wants us to walk closely with Him while making this journey of life, becoming all we were intended to be, but loves us too much to force us along this path. Whether a seed that is already growing and bearing fruit, or a seed still contemplating the possibilities, let us be thankful that we have the gift to choose...to become not only more Christ-like as we journey with Him, but to discover and appreciate our unique, God-given design, as the warmth of Christ's companionship uncovers more and more of who we are as God's son or daughter. May those discovered seeds inspire you and I this day.

Thank you, loving God, for creating each of us and giving us the gift of life. May how we live our lives be our gift to you....Amen
